2. Welcome and Introductions

3. Principal's Report

A) 9 new student enrolments - 1 from pre-primary. 8 - P to 6. All new to Canada. Ms McFeters Gr 5 class- is at 28 students now.

B) New lunch program - emails from the province or HRCE will come directly to parents to begin ordering meals. First delivery in Oct 28. Flenjor company is making the lunches. Prep in Fairview. Are not able to accommodate allergies or gluten free yet. Vegan and Meat options available. Covering 13-17 schools.

C) Student Success Planning (SSP)

- i) Literacy tracking P-3: Tracking literacy continuously at P-3. Looking at how EAL students are doing, African-Nova Scotian students are doing. Through tracking, teachers are able to provide more resource support and small group support.
- ii) Writing conventions Staff agreed that implementing a writing goal as a first goal would be good. Providing pre and post writing prompt to prep students.
- iii) Math fact fluency focused on for all grades. Ensuring regular assessments to inform instructions.

D) Gr 6 Assessment - last day is Thursday Oct 17. Friday can be a make-up day.

E) Gr. 3 Assessment results out now. Students who are currently in Gr. 4. Michelle sent results out to parents today. Springvale did very well. Scored above the average in reading (84% meeting expectation), writing (73% meeting expectation (level 3 or 4), and math (92% meeting expectation - level 3 or 4).

- Level 4 above expectations

There is a spectrum in the scoring to show how close a student is to achieving the next level.

4. SAC Conference - Friday Sept 27 - Michelle and Kass attended. Dr. Sam Hickox was the keynote speaker. He is a Physician Consultant, Office of Addictions and Mental Health, NS Dept of Health and Wellness

Literacy intervention framework. Gr 6 Writing pilot. Math - key actions in each strategy - explained a timeline of implementing strategies.
